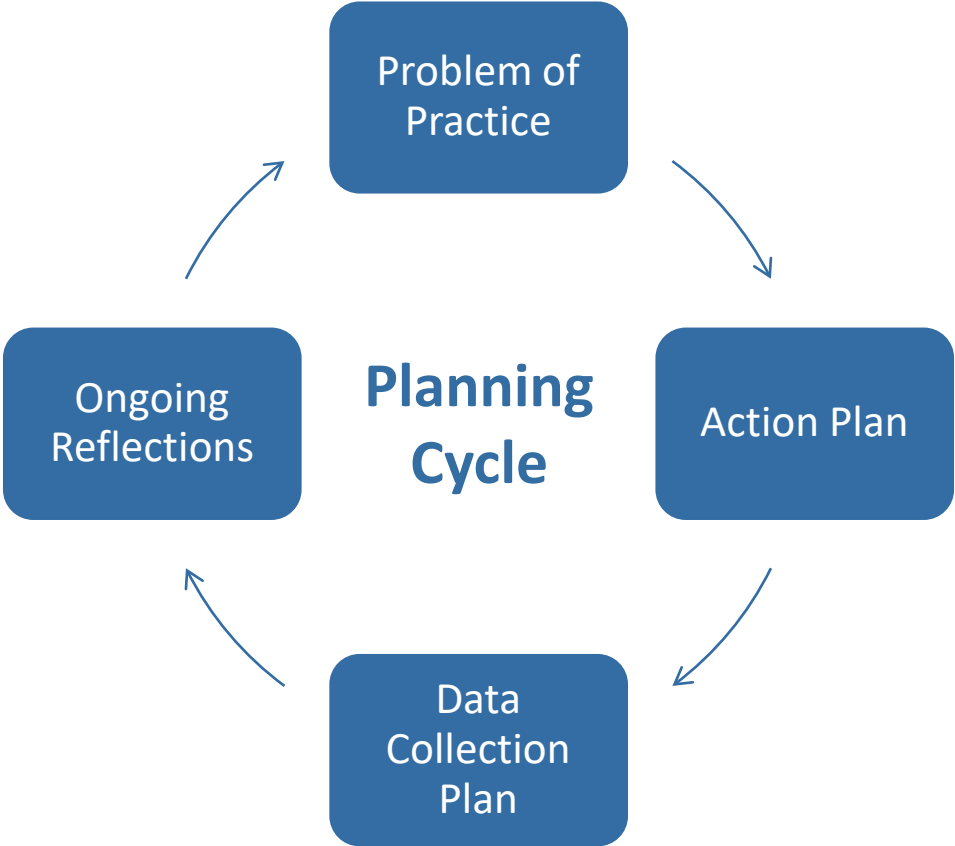
What is the purpose of this Community of Practice?

The CoP activities will be grounded in implementation science...

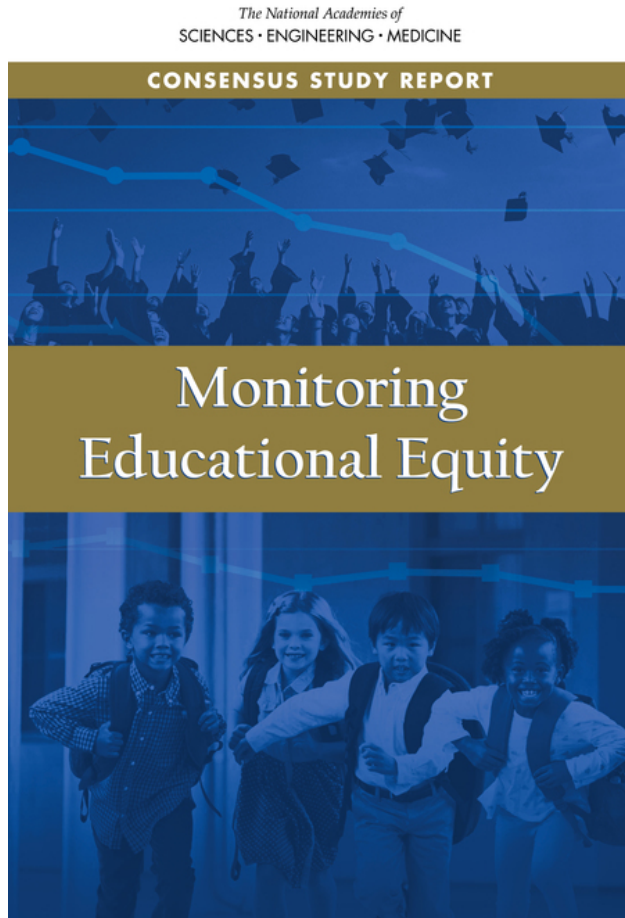


...and our work will be anchored by the NAS Indicators of Educational Equity

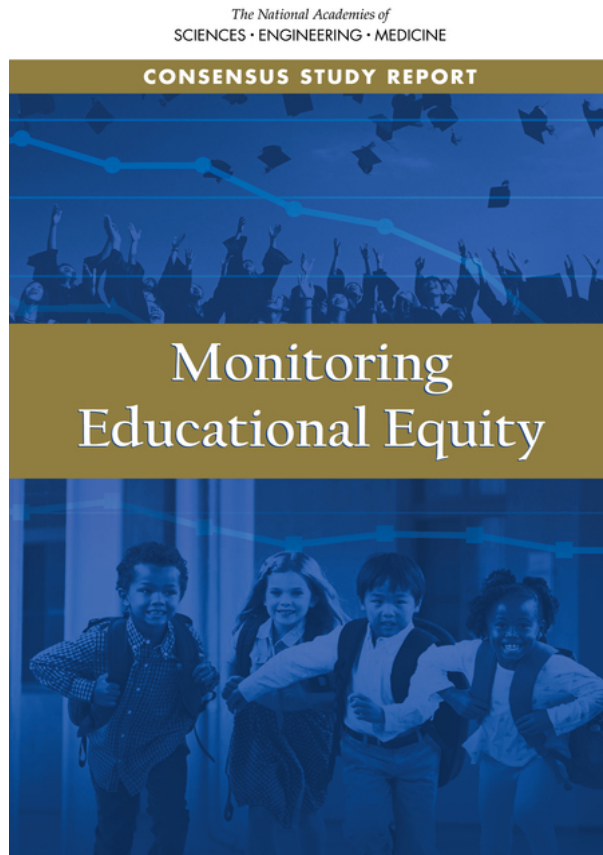
CoP members can expect the following:

- Engage with the National Center and/or its Regional Center to advance work on its problem of practice throughout the year

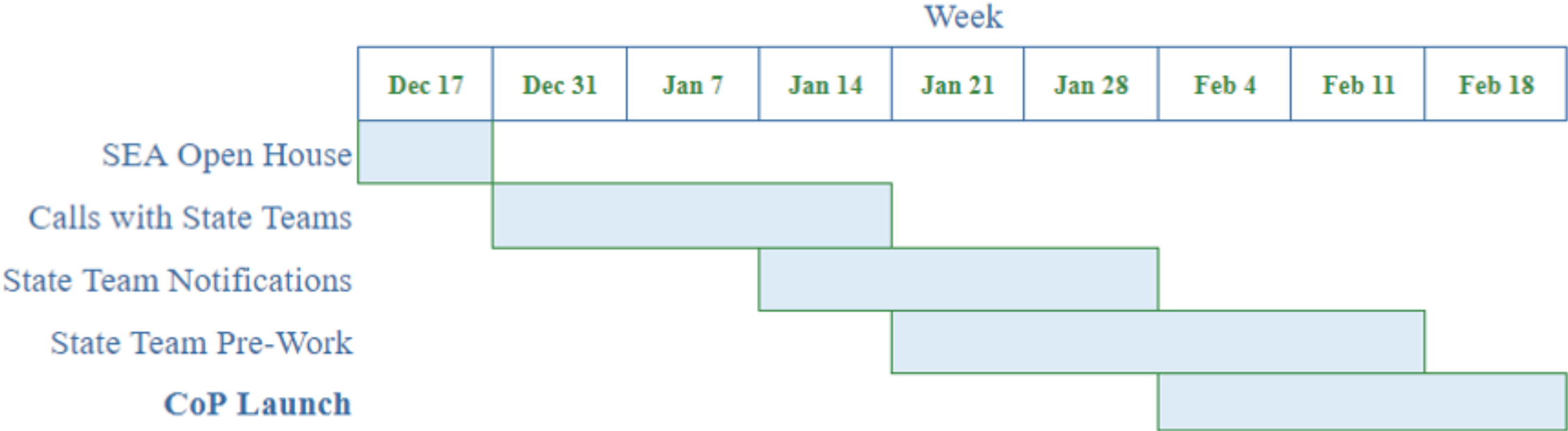
